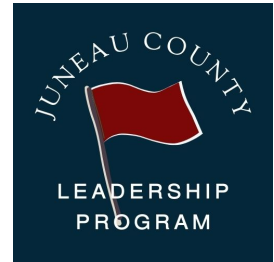

Year in review

- 10 month program September '22 - June '23:
 - 13 graduates from the program, including two senior high school students
 - Formerly covered 29 topics and learned from over 50 businesses & organizations in Juneau County
 - Participants created projects to help businesses succeed at job fairs and are working on creating a Young Professionals Group for the area
- Survey of Alumni from 20 years of the program found:
 - 100% said the program was valuable to them
 - 73% attributed things they learned in the program to helping them earn a promotion
 - 83% said they became more involved in their community after the program
 - 83% said the program helped them in their personal lives
 - 94% feel they are a better asset to their company after going through the Leadership Program

 - We will meet one day each month, travel to and learn about different organizations and businesses in Juneau County
 - Topics covered will include: Leadership potential, personality tests, working with different personalities, finding the positive, working together, problem solving, local government, community relations, homelessness, food banks, education, justice & civil liberties, public safety, agriculture, tourism, natural resources, state government, and economic development
